Term	Definition	Skills 🗸
Application Key	A key usually found on the bottom-right of the keyboard, between the ALT and CTRL keys, but it can be placed in a different location by computer manufacturers. Some keyboards do not have an Application key, so SHIFT+F10 may be used as an alternative.	
Context Menu	A menu that opens by clicking an item once with the right mouse button. Keyboard users may press the <b>APPLICATION key</b> or <b>SHIFT+F10</b> . Items in the context menu may vary depending on what is available at the time it is invoked.	
Maximize/Restore Button	A button on the title bar of most apps near the top right which is used to maximize the window to fill the entire screen or restore it to a smaller size if maximized already.	
Snap Assist	The wizard that shows all running apps that are available to snap to the next zone of remaining zones when using snap layouts.	
Snap Group	Apps grouped together side-by-side or in other arrangements visually on the screen.	
Snap Layout	A grid of layouts that allow you to organize apps and windows in snap groups.	
Task Switcher List	A pop up list showing apps in the current snap group which appears when hovering a mouse pointer over the Taskbar icon for a snap group.	
Task Switching Window	A window accessed by pressing alt+tab which allows one to switch to currently running apps.	
Task View Window	A window accessed by pressing Windows key+tab or by left-clicking the task view button on the Taskbar which allows one to switch to currently running apps.
